ABOUT FANNY BRICE...

Fanny Brice, born in 1898, grew to fame when she became a star in the Ziegfeld Follies. Known for her ability to thrill an audience with a comedic number and seamlessly follow it up with a torch song that brought the audience to tears, Fanny was a truly captivating and versatile performer. Her facile facial expressions and Yiddish accents delighted audiences and built her career to the status of being the highest paid singing female comedienne of her time.

Fanny Brice not only performed in the Ziegfeld Follies, but also on Broadway, in films, and on radio. Baby Snooks, Fanny Brice's signature character, was heard on the radio from 1935 until her death.

Four films were based on Fanny Brice's life: My Man and Rose of Washington Square in the 1930's and more recently Funny Girl (first a hit Broadway musical) and the sequel Funny Lady, which dramatized her rise to fame and her two marriages to gambler Nick Arnstein and producer Billy Rose.

Fanny Brice's legacy continues with countless new recordings of her music, stage productions, and references in television shows such as the Emmy-winning Glee and Boardwalk Empire.

Don't Rain on Her Parade: Kimberly Faye Greenberg Brings Fanny Brice to Fabulous Life

"You are born whoever you are," says Kimberly Faye Greenberg, "And I'm a broad."

The actress and singer is speaking these words onstage at 54 Below as part of Fabulous Fanny, a solo show featuring Greenberg as iconic comedienne Fanny Brice, but it turns out they are just as representative of the artist as of her subject. Offstage, Kimberly and I bond over our shared obsession for the 1920s, and instantly I know — this gal's going to be fun.

Greenberg is the first actress ever to star in two Off-Broadway musicals at the same time, having spent nearly a year zipping back and forth between the roles of Brice in an earlier solo piece, One Night with Fanny Brice, and composer Sylvia Fine in Danny and Sylvia: The Danny Kaye Musical. It seems Kimberly was destined to play bold, brassy, determined ladies of the twentieth century - -women who defied the odds of

class, ethnicity and appearance to get exactly where they wanted to go.



Most of us are encouraged to "think outside the box," but Greenberg's found her greatest successes from diving headfirst into her theatrical niche of historical ladies. Her affinity for Brice began in high school with Funny Girl, the musical based on the star's tumultuous romance with criminal Nick Arnstein, when a teacher informed Kimberly that she resembled Brice and should study to play her part in the show. Though she still has yet to work on Funny Girl, Greenberg became a dedicated student of all things Fanny, researching the performer's life for years before Chip Deffaa, the writer of One Night..., approached her with his script.

When I do something I become engrossed in it, so I started learning everything about Fanny. Funny Girl was the big instigator, but then the universe sort of conspired, because I ended up playing Sylvia Fine — not the same person really, but of a similar build and character, and then [Deffaa] saw me in that and asked me, 'Will you workshop my Fanny Brice show?' Fanny just kept coming back to me threefold; she was shining down and the world opened up.

Watching Kimberly cavort around the stage in Fabulous Fanny, you do get the sense of being thrust back in time. She is as nimble and rubber-faced as Brice in her prime, executing a montage of physical numbers like "Sadie Salome" and "I'm an Indian" with gleeful ease and tossing off joke after joke. It's more than a cabaret in that Greenberg gives you a complete story arc to follow, radiating with such warm, homey intimacy that even newcomers to Brice's canon will leave feeling like experts.

54 Below provides a perfect venue for such a show; its speakeasy-like atmosphere contributes to the impression of having been transported to a 1920s supper club for an evening's entertainment by a famous chanteuse. In fact, until true time travel becomes possible, Kimberly's act is the closest modern audiences will ever come to seeing Fanny in person.

A true team effort, Fabulous Fanny is written by Greenberg with additional material by director Brian Childers, her former Danny and Sylvia costar, and a dedicated supporting team consisting of musical director/arranger Jeff Biering, choreographer Justin Boccitto (who also choreographed One Night...), and pianist Julianne B. Merrill. "For me collaboration is key," Greenberg notes. "We operate so well together that we've been able to create something completely new."

In other words, if you think Fabulous Fanny is just a rehash of One Night ..., think again.

The Off-Broadway show was more like a Wikipedia of facts about Fanny's life. Completely legitimate thing, but when I created this show I really wanted it to be about her emotional journey. What you can take away from this show is, 'Look at Fanny's influence over the world as a whole.' She was the first torch singer, the first Jewish comedienne, the first anything and everything like her. People don't realize it, but her legacy still lives on in show business. We've still got homages to her.

It's this sensory focus on Brice that makes Fabulous Fanny a truly unique experience. The inclusion near the end of the show of a few songs from Funny Girl (and tracks on Greenberg's companion CD from Ghostlight, the Broadway-bound musical in which she also plays Fanny) drives home the idea that this is not merely "the best of Brice," but everyone's Brice, Fanny reimagined in a superb transformation as the gal pal we wish we had.

Something magical happens when an actor inhabits a historical figure as peerlessly as Kimberly does Fanny -- the undertaking creates a third character who exists between reality and fantasy, a person based not on what we recall from life or movies, but someone who lives fully in the short space built onstage for the hour or so we learn about her. In Fabulous Fanny the discoveries are as surprising as they are touching. I realize, for instance, just how much the indomitable Brice depended on and sacrificed for the influential



men that surrounded her: Florenz Ziegfeld, Nick Arnstein, Billy Rose, Irving Berlin. The sequence of Fanny marking time through Arnstein's first marriage and incarceration ("I'd Rather Be Blue Over You Than Be Happy With Somebody Else") is deeply affecting, an accurate portrayal of the mixed emotions involved when the wait for true love runs torturously long.

But it's in performing Brice's signature tune, "My Man," that Greenberg hits her heartfelt crescendo (I espied most of 54 Below's audience tearing up). During this number Fanny's comic mask finally slips, revealing the intense pain she's had to endure despite her talent and energetic attitude. This, Kimberly admits, is her own favorite moment in the show: "It's the eleven o'clock number where everything shifts. It's a more honest Fanny versus the happy-go-lucky Fanny, which is not necessarily who she was."

Beyond this glimpse into a frank, unvarnished Brice, Greenberg's performance also enables her to connect with a deeper part of herself.

The weirdest thing about this show is that it made me realize who I am. I was always really shy, but now I'm not so afraid of things, and I think it's because of playing Fanny in a show where it's just me. Because of her and her chutzpah, I'm a better person.

And as Greenberg continues to move through her various historical women - she'll be portraying playwright Lillian Hellman, socialite Kathleen Kennedy and Marguerite Taylor (daughter of Laurette) in a series of plays from Beautiful Soup Theater this May -- she constantly unearths more treasures inside herself, proof that "knowing thy specialty" is both a professional and personal blessing.

"I always tell people, 'Don't worry about getting pigeonholed in something," Kimberly asserts. "As you find your niche, people appreciate more of what you've got to offer and it expands your scope of opportunity."

Of course there's plenty of opportunity still ahead for Kimberly Faye Greenberg thanks to her spirit guide Fanny, with Ghostlight in constant development, Fabulous Fanny set to tour, and her companion album of Brice songs newly released. No matter what other adventures arise (like Greenberg's recent appearance in Bookseller in the Rain, Tim Realbuto's star-studded concert tribute to Maury Yeston), Fanny survives them all.

"One of my friends works with a medium," says Greenberg, when I ask if she's ever tried to contact Brice spiritually. "And one day she said to me, 'I swear you were Fanny in a previous life.' Well, that would make perfect sense. I feel like I was just born to play her. Obviously we need each other."

Glancing around the joyful faces of the audience at 54 Below, I'd say that people who need people, especially when they're both strong, funny, and fabulous women, really are the luckiest people in the world. How very lucky for us.

Kimberly Faye Greenberg, who has played the legendary Fanny Brice in ONE NIGHT WITH FANNY BRICE and the Broadway-bound GHOSTLIGHT, released FABULOUS FANNY: THE SONGS & STORIES OF FANNY BRICE last summer. Taking on the persona of Fanny Brice, Kimberly Faye Greenberg fills FABULOUS FANNY: THE SONGS & STORY OF FANNY BRICE with the razzle dazzle and showmanship that made the performer a true star and legend in her own right. With a brassy belt, a powerful nasal timbre that is used to add emphasis, and a delightfully light alto instrument, Kimberly Faye Greenberg pristinely channels the renowned icon as she performs.

Thanks to Barbra Streisand, I know a bit about American illustrated song model, correction, singer, theatre and film actress Fanny Brice. But I have never been that familiar with the music that made her famous, until now with the release of this lovely album Fabulous Fanny.

Over the course of twelve really well-picked tracks, singer Kimberty Faye Greenberg takes the listener through some wonderful songs associated with Fanny, starting with 'probably her best known song, Second Hand Rose' which she first introduced in the 'Ziegfeld Follies of 1921'. However this isn't just an album of thed and trusted favourites and Kimberty along with accompanist Christopher McGovern has included some tracks that haven't been heard since they were originally recorded in the 1920s and 30s making this a great compilation of the lady's works. So, along with my own personal favourite 'Don't Rain on my Parade' there is 'When a Woman Loves a Man' from the 1930 film 'Be Yourself'. Some of the songs – for example 'Make 'Em Laugh' – are really just a bit of frivolous entertainment whilst others, such as the highly emotional 'My Man'



are really deep and need to be listened to more than once to appreciate Channing Pollock's wonderful lyrics. Then there are the, what would be considered today, politically incorrect songs such as 'Cooking Breakfast for the one I Love'. In fact I have to admit I was pleasurably surprised at the range of song styles covered in this album.

Kimberly Faye Greenberg has a lovely voice and delivers each song clearly, often with a definite smile in her voice that conveys her own obvious love for Fanny Brice's musical legacy. The only minor issue for me is that some of these songs — especially when matched with Kimberly's voice — really need a full orchestra with soaring strings to fully do justice to the melody itself. However, having said that I could easily imagine sitting in a small nightclub, drink in hand, having a thoroughly enjoyable evening listening to Kimberly deliver this album live.

On Fabulous Fanny, Kimberly Faye Greenberg has done a great job at bringing to life the wonderful music of Ms Brice – and I think anyone listening to it will be surprised by the number of tracks they recognise – and ensuring that she is accessible to future generations. A lovely album that should be in everyone's collection and played whenever you feel like you need cheering up.

For a decade Kimberly Faye Greenberg has been channeling the spirit and music of the great comedy icon Fanny Brice. With two successful recordings and three separate productions based on Brice's life to her credit, it is easy to see how Greenberg is quickly becoming America's Fanny Brice go-to-gal.

On February 12, at 7pm, Greenberg brings her Fanny Brice in a one woman cabaret Fabulous Fanny: The Songs and Stories of Fanny Brice to 54 Below, Broadway's Supper Club. Kim recently took a few minutes out of her rehearsal to chat with StageBuddy and share her insights about Fanny and a bit of a sneak peek

Kim, thank you for chatting with us today. For those that don't know Fanny Brice can you tell us who she was and why she is an important figure in the history of American theater?

Fanny Brice is a legendary Jewish comedienne, Ziegfeld Follies star, recording artist, film actor and voice of "Baby Snooks" on the radio for 25 years. And, of course, the inspiration for the musical Funny Girl.

As part of the Ziegfeld Follies in the 1920s, Fanny Brice is part of the backbone of the development of American musical theater, Her music, "My Man", "Second Hand Rose", "Rose of Washington Square", and so many more became classics in the American Songbook.

Also, she was the highest paid female artist of her time and paved the way for so many future female comedians/torch singers. She was the FIRST!!

You are so well versed in the art, craft and repertoire of Fanny Brice. What drew you to her as a character and how did you come to be so expert in her life and art.

Fanny seems to have been in the cards for me since birth. I think she chose me - I'm not even kidding. My middle name is Faye in honor of my great grandmother who was named Fanny.

I was actually introduced to Fanny Brice by a teacher who said to me, "You look like this gal and if you are going to be a performer you should study who she is so you could play her in Funny Girl." Little did I know what my life journey would take.

Mastering her repertoire and persona took some years. I watched her movies, read books, listened to

resources of the New York Public Library and the Paley Center. Both have so much material that isn't accessible anywhere else. I researched her for about 7 years before I actually played her. As the saying



What is it about Fanny Brice that inspires and connects to you personally?

In order to play her truthfully I had to find the qualities that existed in her and then find them in me so that I can bring them to the surface truthfully, both emotionally and physically. Interestingly, the more I embody her in front of an audience, the more those qualities come out in me. Playing her has helped me to find myself in a way. She has shown me how to be confident, how to speak the truth and be bold and brassy as a performer.

Are there any surprises you discovered in your research about Fanny Brice that the general public might enjoy knowing?

It's not particularly well known that she was married three times! If you know about Fanny Brice you may know about her 2nd marriage to Julius W. "Nicky" Amstein because it was a major part of the film and musical Funny Girl. Nicky Amstein was one of the most famous con artists of his time having successfully stolen millions of dollars worth of Wall Street bonds in the biggest heist

Her third husband, Billy Rose, wrote many of the songs Fanny sang. They were married for a few years until he left her for the swimming star Eleanor Holm. This relationship was dramatized in the movie Funny Lady.

Now who was her first husband you make ask? His name was Frank Wright. He was a barber and the marriage lasted 3 days.

Have you performed Funny Girl?

Ironically enough, no, but this is the third version of a Fanny Brice oriented show that I have done including One Night With Fanny Brice (Off-Broadway), Ghostlight (a Broadway bound musical currently in development). I also have 2 successful CD's of Fanny Brice's music that can be found on all the major music/streaming sites. Playing Fanny in Funny Giff would be icing on the cake. It just hasn't worked out yet.

I am really excited to learn a member of the Dorothy Parker Society is continuing an amazing project that would tickle Mrs. Parker to know about. Actress-Singer Kimberly Faye Greenberg is bringing her one-woman show Fabulous Fanny: The Songs and Stories of Fanny Brice to 54 Below in Manhattan on February 12, 2015.

When I was editing Dorothy Parker Complete Broadway, 1918-1923, I came across scores of references to Fanny. Mrs. Parker was a big fan of the Ziegfeld Follies, and always gave good reviews to Fanny, year after year. In 1921, Mrs. Parker printed Fanny's immortal line, "I've been a bad woman—but such good company," and said her appearance in the Follies that year was the highlight.

Ninety-four years later, a big fan of Fanny's has put together a show that showcases her gifts. Kimberly was kind enough to give us a question-andanswer about the show, and what attracts her to the life of Fanny Brice.

What first drew you to Fanny, and why did you want to produce your show?

I wasn't actually planning to do another solo show after performing in the one Off-Broadway, but several groups had seen me in that show and wanted more so they commissioned me to write another show! And the rest is history. Not only has Fabulous Fanny been touring all over the East, but also I released the cast album in July and that has taken off as well. I'm truly thrilled to be able to continue and honor her legacy in the most realistic way possible.



Is there something you learned about Fanny that inspires you?

She inspires me daily! Fanny was so independent, confident, she was not afraid to do things out of the ordinary and, of course, so full of chutzpah! In portraying Fanny I had to bring all these qualities in myself to the forefront and bring them out on stage, and, the more I did that, the more I realized how these things have all become a large part of me in my own daily life. She has helped me to become who I am! I couldn't be more grateful.

What is it about the era Fanny performed in that makes it appealing to you?

I LOVE the 1920s through the 1940s! I always have. Long before I even knew Fanny would be such a huge part of my life. In some instances I almost feel like I was born after my time especially since I not only play Fanny but so many other historical women in other theatre projects. I just love the music, the evolving independence/leadership/sexual freedom women began to take along with their fashion that evolved with it. The architecture, the newness of Broadway, and World War II. I'm highly fascinated by WWII

What's your favorite Fanny song and what's it mean to you?

I think this might surprise people because it's very much one of her lesser-known tunes (but a standard regardless), it's "If You Want The Rainbow, You Must Have The Rain." Not only is the tune itself beautiful in its simplicity, but it's also the meaning of this song that I love. The whole song is about if you want anything good to happen in life then you must face the bad and keep on keeping on no matter what, and good things will eventually evolve that usually end up being better then you ever thought they could be. And boy, can I relate, as I think most people can. In a way too the song becomes a celebration if I'm in good spirits or pushes to keep me moving forward if things are awry as well.

If Fanny were around what do you think she'd make of the Broadway scene today?

You know, that is a really good question, I'm not sure. Fanny was alive in its heyday. So I would more aim to think she wouldn't like the fact that contemporary musical theater has sort of lost a lot of its glitz/glamour due to trying to recreate a more film-like "real" atmosphere on stage. The spectacle of a Ziegfeld Follies rarely exists anymore and that's what she was used to. But on the other side of the coin, her affiliation with "My Man" and just standing there and singing with no spectacle involved and, of course, being the first torch singer and wanting to carve out a niche for herself of being a more "real" performer and not just pigeonholed as a comedienne. Perhaps she would like the evolution of the contemporary musical. Who knows...regardless today, she would be thrilled we are still honoring the legacy of American musical theatre for which she was a part.

Hometown: Born in Long Beach... But I think it's now NYC as I lived here 16 years.. Isn't it at "10" that it becomes hometown??

Education: BA in Drama from University of CA Irvine

Select Credits: First and Only actress to play leading roles in 2 Off-Broadway musicals at the same time; Sylvia in Danny and Sylvia: The Danny Kaye Musical (which ran 3 years) and Fanny Brice in the solo show "One Night With Fanny Brice". That foray as Fanny opened a lot of doors for me. I now play Fanny in The Broadway bound musical Ghostlight which has had numerous Broadway investor readings etc...and of course in my own solo touring show Fabulous Fanny coming to 54 Below. I now have two successful albums as Fanny too! And, of course, I've worked a ton across the board in tv, film, theatre etc in many other lead/supporting roles.

Why theater?: Oh goodness. I've been doing it since I was in 4th grade. I went to this theatre arts camp and I was hooked. It's like a drug. Once you're hooked... That's it. There is nothing else.

Tell us about Fabulous Fanny: The Songs and Stories of Fanny Brice: I like to call my show a "Cabaret with a twist" ...I channel Fanny basically the entire show (There is a twist in the end and I won't give that away here... you have to come see the show.) Anyhow I play her in full costume, hair, make-up etc. and, as Ms. Brice, I sing/talk about her life. There is a story arc. I don't in any way consider it a Wikipedia of facts. It is much more intimate and focuses more so on her the loves of her life (she was married 3 times) and her fun/interesting anecdotes. That combined with her famous, and not so famous songs, that, for the most part were inspired by the happenings in her life, create what is an evening where Fanny Brice fans and those that may not even know who she is can get to know this legend who, in actuality, has inspired so many future comedians (Lucille Ball, Gracie Allen etc), singers like Barbra Streisand (who also sings many of Fanny Brice's standards), the genre of musical theatre/American theatre history and such story arcs/mentions on todays hit television shows like Boardwalk Empire, Glee and so much more!

What inspired you to create Fabulous Fanny: The Songs and Stories of Fanny Brice?: Well, its funny how the universe conspires to keep bringing Fanny Brice back into my life. I wasn't actually looking to create another solo show, having just done one Off-Broadway, but several venues who saw me in that Off- Broadway show wanted more and they commissioned me to write a new show! And here we are! Needless to say the show was a success at those venues and I've kept touring it ever since!

What kind of theater speaks to you? What or who inspires you as an artist?: Really smart musicals/plays that make you think. and that gives the actor something to sink their teeth into. But I also love big spectacle musicals, the more traditional the better. that just put a huge grin on your face... My theme is getting repetitive...but Fanny Brice! She has inspired me and practically my entire acting career. She was so confident, proud of who she was and what she did, she was so full of chutzpah and took so many risks! Just incorporating those traits into my life has brought me so much inspiration, which has led to me taking huge leaps of faith in all areas of my career as an artist.

Any roles you're dying to play?: Besides the obvious of Fanny in Funny Girl... Reno in Anything Goes, Fantine or Mdm T in Les Mis, Aldonza in La Mancha, Mama Rose in Gypsy...all the big, bold brassy women...they are my favorite! Of course I love creating roles too... I tend to do so much more of that lately in both plays and musicals. Listen I just want to keep working... Give me a role and I will play it.

What's your favorite showtune?: That's easy... "Don't Rain on My Parade"... That never gets old.

If you could work with anyone you've yet to work with, who would it be?: Patti Luponellii I love her and all she does and everything she stand for. She did this interview once in Time Out magszine that I have had hanging on my fridge for years... In it it says (and I'm paraphrasing here) how she never gave up making big bold choices and being true to who she is as an artist. regardless of whether or not that means going against the grain. I just love and appreciate that. I so dream of play her daughter!! We would make a good team. Any casting/ producers reading this?

Who would play you in a movie about yourself and what would it be called?: Oh goodness... I have no clue... I think we would have to do an open call and give an unknown a chance. I'm all about rooting for the underdog... And, I think I'm totally stumped on a title as well... lets leave that to the writer who is being paid big bucks to make my story nice and overly dramatic. ha ha ha.

What show have you recommended to your friends?: On The Town! I loved it!

What's your biggest guility pleasure?: Penny & nickel monopoly slot machines in Atlantic City

What's up next?: Well, my Fabulous Fanny show will be at 54 Below on February 12th at 7pm! Its such a great, intimate venue and the atmosphere is so perfect for a 1920s/30's era show about Fanny Brice! Come see it! And, after that I'm thrilled to be singing in a tribute concert for Maury Yeston (who will be in attendance) called "Bookseller in the Rain" at the Metropolitan Room with my friend, and Ghostlight creative, Tim Realbuto and a bevy of other amazing Broadway folk.

Review:

Have you heard the story of the famous comedian whose antics delight millions of devoted fans but whose personal life is a mess? Of course you have! No playwright ever lost money assuring audiences that behind every clown's smile lurks a tragic past. This moralistic myth becomes even more ubiquitous when our hap-hap-pappy hero is a woman, doomed by our cultural biases to wallow in Marianistic melancholy in order to earn our pity and affection.

You won't find any of that nonsense in Kimberly Faye Greenberg's refreshingly upbeat portrait of Fanny Brice, though. Twentieth-century America's original "Funny Girl" was born to unentitled immigrant parents dwelling in New York City's Lower East Side ghetto, leaving their ambitious daughter no recourse but to forge success on nothing but talent, chutzpah, and a refusal to allow other people's' problems to become her problems-all practical traits for a tough cookie with a habit of marrying men long on romantic fancy, but short on reliability.

So, for every sentimental schmaltzspiele in the score of this solo revue-"Me and My Shadow," "More Than You Know" and the inevitable hankle-wringing French-import torcher "My Man"-Greenberg includes an upbeat patter song like "Always Leave Them Laughing When You Say Goodbye" or the vintage dialect ditty "Sadie Salome, Go Home" that launched not one, but two careers in 1909-Brice's and that of "Irv from the neighborhood" (or as goyishe musical mavens know him, Irving Berlin). Greenberg's script even takes us forward in time to include the barn-burning anthem "Don't Rain On My Parade" from the musical Funny Girl.

To be sure, a comic aesthetic based in equal-opportunity Otherness can be problematic these days, but Greenberg tones down the parochial elements inherent therein to project a gemutlich conviviality rendering even the potentially offensive "I'm an Indian, Too" free of any rancor. Displaying a chesty vocal delivery well up to the challenge of replicating Brice's legendary long final notes and a supple physique capable of conjuring a bevy of auxiliary characters (including several gentlemen suitors), aided only by an eight-foot pink feather boa and half a size XX overcoat, with further assistance provided by pianoman Christopher McGovern for this performance, Greenberg's "Second Hand Rose" persona commands the stage to embrace her virtual audience like a big warm hua.

If you're looking for a good 75 minutes of Theatre and entertainment Broadway style then stream Fabulous Fanny. What is the first thing that comes to mind when you hear her name? To me it's Barbra Streisand in Funny Girl. Mrs Brice was probably the first true business savvy female Jewish comedian from Brooklyn, and that's probably where Ms. Streisand got her moncho. A little history about this remarkable woman, born in 1889 to Hungarian-Jewish immigrants her father was a saloon owner. Which is probably where she got her Moxy she dropped out of school to work in burlesque, and two years later with a bet with a backstage manager for \$5bucks she got to audition for George Cohen and managed to get fired the same night from him. But after learning to dance she met Florenz Ziegfeld and that started her association with the Follies at \$20 bucks a week

In 1921 with the Follies, she sang the song "My Man" and a star was born her contract was torn up and a new one was drawn paying her \$200 a week. In todays money that is about \$2,904.00, a year later her second hit "Secondhand Rose". From that there was no stopping her, she became a Ziegfeld Follies/ Broadway star,

recording artist, film actress and one of the most popular radio stars in history being the voice of "Baby Snooks".



This show was shot before a live audience using several cameras which gives in a true feeling of being an audience member.

Fanny Brice is played by Kimberly Faye Greenberg who captures her essence and spirit in this one woman show. While reminiscing about her life story and 3 marriages, she entertains with popular hits and songs inspired by this great woman.

How will YOU be observing Fanny Brice's birthday? I started this day out by watching Fabulous Fanny: The Songs and Stories of Fanny Brice, Kimberly Faye Greenberg's one woman show that tells the story of Brice in song and patter. Is it chutzpah to do a show about Brice that's not Funny Girl? Of course, and Greenberg possesses it in spades. But chutzpah is a virtue in show biz and Fabulous Fanny occupies a different lane than Funny Girl — it's not a book show, but a first person "biographical" telling punctuated with the songs we associate with Brice like "Second Hand Rose", "Lovey Joe", etc etc etc. In short, it's Fanny straight up and uncut, for those who want a SHOT of Fanny — not a short list, I should hope, among theatre lovers. As for the performance, Greenberg is brassy and exuberant, faithful to the original and no shrinking violet. It'll give you a nice escape for an hour, and though there are sad patches in Brice's biography, the saddest fact that will emerge from the show is the realization that you don't get to see it in a real theatre at the moment. But Greenberg, like her hero, is a smart cookie — she's already taking bookings for 2021-23, for as soon as this Covid mishigas is over. It's perfect for cabarets, schools, colleges, community centers, and as someone who works the senior circuit himself I say this with no arch intentions - senior centers! But til then, watch it now! As a teen, actor Kimberly Faye Greenberg was told she resembled Fanny Brice, and so Greenberg studied the comedienne extensively in the hope of one day performing the lead role in *Funny Girl*.

Greenberg went on to perform in the one woman off-Broadway production One Night with Fanny Brice, which she performed whilst also appearing in another off-Broadway production, Danny and Sylvia: The Danny Kaye Musical (reportedly making Greenberg "the first and only actress ever to star in two off-Broadway musicals at the same time"). Greenberg was also cast as Brice in workshop productions of Ghostlight: The Musical.

After One Night with Fanny Brice, Greenberg was commissioned to develop her own one woman show based on Fanny Brice, Fabulous Fanny: The Life and Stories of Fanny Brice. Greenberg's show aimed to channel more of Fanny Brice's emotional journey.

Songs in Fabulous Fanny include "My Man", "Second-Hand Rose", "Rose of Washington Square", "Cooking Breakfast for the One I Love", "When a Women Loves A Man", "Sadie Salome", and other songs sung and inspired by Fanny Brice.

After a performance at Studio 54, Huffington Post reviewer Jamie Lubin enthused, "Something magical happens when an actor inhabits a historical figure as peerlessly as Kimberly does Fanny."

Since 2013, Fabulous Fanny has been performed in venues across New York and regionally in the US.

A cast album was released in 2014, and is widely available.

Fabulous Fanny was filmed live during its run at the Nelson Hall Theatre in Cheshire, Connecticut in March, 2018.
